



The Mauritshuis has officially been a museum since 1822 when it was given the name Royal Picture Gallery Mauritshuis.

The Mauritshuis was originally built in the 17th century as a residence for Johan Maurits, Count of Nassau-Siegen (1604 - 1679). It is therefore literally the house of Johan Maurits.

Two sites

In addition to the Mauritshuis, your ticket also allows you to visit Gallery Prins Willem V. A hidden gem just steps away from the Mauritshuis. This is where the Mauritshuis collection originated. In the Gallery you will find about 150 paintings from this collection.


Guided tours

Residential house in the heart of The Hague

The Mauritshuis in The Hague was built as a residence for Count Johan Maurits of Nassau-Siegen (1604 – 1679). He was a cousin of William of Orange and governor of the Dutch colony in Brazil between 1636 and 1644. Johan Maurits was both commissioner and first occupant of the house, hence the name: Maurits' house. Later, the building was given various other functions. In 1822 the Mauritshuis became a museum.

The Mauritshuis is located on the Hofvijver, next to the buildings of the Dutch government and parliament. In the 19th and 20th century the Mauritshuis grew into a museum that receives many visitors from home and abroad every year.

Not only the paintings, but the building itself is a sight to behold. Thanks to the creaking wooden floors, silk wallpaper on the walls and chandeliers on the ceiling.

Treat yourself to a masterpiece from the collection in the form of a wonderful piece of jewellery, a beautifully-designed greetings card or an accessory for the home: a fridge magnet, cushion or tea light holder. For children, there are games and fun children's books. One of these tells the story of the Mauritshuis's resident mouse: Maurits Mouse (only Maurits Mouse and Rembrandt is available in English). As you would expect, the Girl with a Pearl Earring is everywhere in the shop. Let her protect you from the rain (umbrella, rain hat and jacket) or help you cook (apron and oven gloves), take her travelling (suitcase) or cycling (bicycle bell), enjoy a cup of coffee with her (tray) or take her into the bath (a bestseller: the Girl rubber duck)!

Flowers are a popular theme in the shop, with magnificent bouquets adorning various items. These include gloves, charger plates, serving trays and shawls decorated with tulips, roses, peonies, lilies and other deliciously scented plants. Eye-catching reproductions of all the collection highlights are available to buy: Girl with a Pearl Earring, *View of Delft* (also by Johannes Vermeer) and of course the world's most-famous bird: *The Goldfinch* by Carel Fabritius. The very first museum of the Netherlands

The Prince William V Gallery lies a stone's throw from the Mauritshuis. Around 150 Dutch and Flemish masterpieces from the Mauritshuis collection are displayed there, including works by Jan Steen, Paulus Potter, Frans van Mieris, Gerard van Honthorst and Peter Paul Rubens. Together they show how large the royal picture collection belonging to Prince William V of Orange-Nassau (1748 – 1806) was. The Prince William V Gallery was the first public art collection in the Netherlands. The prince had the gallery created in 1774 to display his impressive paintings. The walls were crammed full to clearly demonstrate the wealth of his collection.

The Prince William V Gallery is located at Buitenhof 33, a five-minute walk from the Mauritshuis.



First gigapixel museum

The Mauritshuis is the first museum in the world to have been fully digitised in gigapixel format. By bringing this together with its Second Canvas app, the stories behind the paintings are also revealed and you can zoom in on individual brushstrokes. No fewer than 36 masterpieces, including all the Vermeers, four Rembrandts, three Jan Steens, Fabritius's *Goldfinch* and *The Bull* by Paulus Potter, can all be enjoyed in exquisite detail.
